## CHILDREN'S USE OF THE LIBRARY POLICY

Pine River Library welcomes library use by children and strives to create a comfortable environment for visitors of all ages. The library offers many programs and services that encourage children to develop a love of books, reading, and learning. Staff members are available to assist children with library materials or services.

- The library is not a childcare facility and does not provide long-term or short-term child care.
- Parents and caregivers are reminded that unattended children may be at risk in any public place including the library.
- Unlike a school the library is open to all members of the community. Library staff do not monitor the arrival or departure of children unless signed into a program that requires registration.
- Children attending library programs that are run on a registration basis are supervised by the library staff only during the scheduled time of the program.
- For the safety and comfort of children, a responsible adult or caregiver should accompany children while they are using the library or on library property.
- Parents and caregivers are responsible for monitoring and regulating the behavior of their children at the library.
- When library staff determines that a child is at risk, vulnerable, or disruptive, they will attempt to contact the parent or guardian. In the event that the parent or guardian cannot be reached, the child will be placed in the care of local law enforcement.
- Library staff will not transport children home or to any other destination under any circumstances and are not responsible for children traveling to or from the library.
- The children's area of the library is specifically designed to serve the needs of minor patrons. Adults in the children's area, not accompanying a child, may be asked to leave the children's area and use other parts of the library.
- Parents or guardians should be aware of library opening and closing times and library program times and make suitable arrangements to meet and/or transport their children. Occasionally the library may have to close unexpectedly due to emergencies, safety issues, or inclement weather. It is the responsibility of parents, guardians, or caregivers to let their children know what they should do if the library closes unexpectedly.



Parents and guardians are reminded that they are responsible for supervising • their children's access to library materials and resources, including the internet. While the staff members are always available to lead young people to interesting materials selected with children's interests and needs in mind, it is assumed that children who visit the library unattended are authorized to use the full range of materials available to our customers.

All decisions concerning an unattended child's safety or behavior are based on the library's Code of Conduct Policy applied by the informed judgment of library staff.

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
